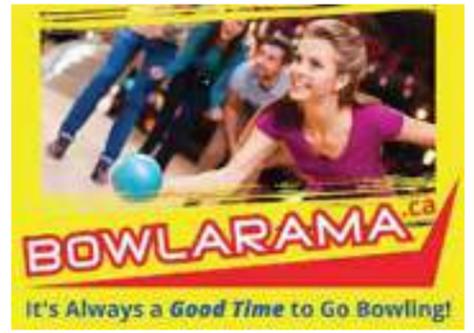

## DISCOVERING OUR PAST

### Roman Catholics in Ketch Harbour celebrate 125th anniversary of church

Not all communities in Mainland South had enough Roman Catholic families to warrant the building of a place of worship. Families who traced their heritage to England, Scotland and several European countries settled in Sambro, Pennant, Harrietsfield and Spryfield. They were predominantly Methodist, Presbyterian and Church of England. By 1800, however, Ketch Harbour and Herring Cove had become home to a great number of Irish Catholic fishermen and their families. A church was built in Prospect in 1794 and the priest from that community served the Roman Catholic population of Ketch Harbour and Herring Cove. By 1806 Ketch Harbour had its own church. The first priest in Prospect, Father Thomas Grace, was also the first priest at Ketch Harbour.

One hundred and twenty five years ago, in 1892, a new church opened in Ketch Harbour. The priest at that time was Father Thomas Grace, not to be confused with the earlier priest with the same name. The 1806 church building, St. Peter's, was on a site that is now Ketch Harbour's oldest cemetery. St. Peter's was also the name of the first Roman Catholic Church in Halifax before it was replaced by St. Mary's Cathedral in 1820. If you are looking for ancestors from Ketch Harbour, check the NS Archives for church records from St. Peter's and St. Mary's Church in Halifax which began recording them in 1800. When Ketch Harbour was part of the Prospect parish, priests travelled by boat to the coastal communities, recording their baptisms and marriage records in the Halifax church. Very few burial records were recorded. The burial record for the first Father Thomas Grace was recorded in Our Lady of Mount Carmel Church in Prospect, but he was buried in the old Ketch Harbour cemetery on March 5, 1827 by Reverend James Dunphy. On Father Grace's headstone is written "A Capuchin from County Kilkenny, Ireland". He was 75 years old.

From 1823 to 1837 records for this area may be found in Our Lady

of Mount Carmel Church in Prospect. Anyone doing research on Roman Catholic ancestors from the communities of Ferguson's Cove to Ketch Harbour would be wise to check these early church records. They are invaluable. The first church in Herring Cove, St. Patrick's, opened in 1837 and was located in the old cemetery on John Brackett Drive. The present church, St. Paul's, was built in about 1849. In 1952 St. Paul's was completely renovated and enlarged. Its tall, graceful spire was removed for easier maintenance.

Going through census records for Ketch Harbour, it became obvious why a larger church was needed. In 1827 all 26 families living in Ketch Harbour were Roman Catholic, a total population of 162. Fishing was listed as the only occupation. In 1829, of the 26 fishing families, nine were also Harbour Pilots, namely John Martin, Jr, Daniel Gallagher, Richard Flemming, Bapt. Martin, Peter Martin, William McDaniel (McDonald), Daniel Martin, and Patrick Ronayne. By 1871 the population had increased to 273 and, once again, all followed the Roman Catholic religion. When you factor in the number of Roman Catholics living next door in Portuguese Cove in 1871 (180 of them) and the age and deteriorating condition of the 1806 church building, a new and

larger church in Ketch Harbour was long overdue. As a fundraiser for the new church, pews were sold for five dollars each.

Herring Cove and Ketch Harbour separated from the parish of Prospect in about 1850 and one priest served both churches until 1937. From 1937 to 2001, the two churches were separate, each parish supporting its own priest. Since 2001 the parishes of St. Paul's, Herring Cove, and St. Peter's, Ketch Harbour, have shared one priest

and are now under one name, St. Peter and St. Paul.

On Saturday, June 24, 2017, St. Peter and St. Paul Parish will celebrate the 125th anniversary of St. Peter's Church site in Ketch Harbour. There will be planned public events on Saturday, June 24th from 2:30 pm to 5:30 pm. Enjoy Church Tours, Historical Displays and Story Telling (featuring the Seniors of the parish); also a BBQ in the garden. Mass will be held at 6 pm in the 125 year old church. That same evening, from 7:30 pm until 11:30 pm, you can enjoy a Kitchen Party in the church hall. Many people in Ketch Harbour and surrounding communities will recall the regular Saturday night dances after the 2nd World War, continuing into

the 1950s and 1960s. The dance music was live, played by the talented Sullivan family of Kline Heights.

In addition to Saturday's events in Ketch Harbour, another event, "Feast of St. Peter and St. Paul", is planned for Thursday, June 29th, at St. Paul's Church site in Herring Cove. Mass from 7 pm to 8 pm will be celebrated by Archbishop Mancini. A social gathering and reception will take place in the church hall from 8:30 pm to 10:30 pm. This, too, is open to the public, no matter what religion you follow.

# “Food, Glorious Food” at Spryfield Market

FOOD, glorious FRESH FOOD at the Spryfield Market re-opening!! Mother’s Day Sunday morning I happily spent two hours strolling around chatting with vendors, as well as friends I ran into. Every vendor had a great story, and often a sweet deal on some unique product. My May favorites, below, included some plants for the garden and most of my groceries for the week:

Strawberry transplants (bareroot, everbearing plants) from Higbee’s Berry Farm, at only 50 cents each. Higbee’s will have strawberries in June and all summer, but I love the idea of the kids picking some from my own garden too.

Unusual herbs at Odds and Herbs: Shane explained that the Citronella

transplants would keep the bugs at bay in the garden, or when I steep the leaves in a tincture (I love the smell!). I also stocked up on his wonderful organic greens for salads and cooking for the week, including some wild purslane and sorrel to try - taste adventures ahead! He’ll keep bringing interesting garden herbs for planting as well as great veggies and free-run eggs all summer.

At the Mount Denson Blueberries table, I got some yummy jam to last ’til their crop comes in later this summer - 100% local blueberries at a very reasonable price, when you buy a 500 oz jar. He also had perfect sweet potatoes fresh from cold storage.

Zoe’s Kimchi – I could not pass that table without buying a jar of

the hot variety for a friend of mine who loves spicy! Other stops for spices and condiments to arm you for some delicious quick meal preparation: Shivani’s (Indian spices), Char’s Country Dips and Seasonings, Prepped Pasta (fresh sauces), Hibiscus Specialty Foods’ chutneys, and, for Sunday movie night: Big Monkey Kettle Corn in 6 different flavours.

Dine at the Market: Time for breakfast or an early lunch? There’s the excellent African (Ivory Coast) menu at the ACICC cafe, and a new option: Brother Khurshid’s Halal Shack, both offering a full meal or substantial snack. Try the amazing Pakistani samosas at Brother K’s, with all Halal local beef. Ate too much? Some sweet Ginger or Sorrel drink from the ACICC cafe will aid your digestion. Or check the Stellaria HerbalsTeas table for a good curative tea mix to make at home.

Relax with a sweet: Take a few minutes to sit with a coffee and listen to the buskers, watch the face-painter, or check your smartphone (free WIFI). Buy goodies to nibble on or take a nice package home from Spryfield’s own Mrs.P’s Homestyle bakery or From Heart-to-Heart Cakes (Czech chef Hana makes European style pastries, including some gluten-free choices). Bakery items also make great gifts: Halicakes offered some innovative cupcake bouquets for

Mother’s Day!





WaterDragon Pottery is based in Herring Cove, where LiLynn Wan makes and sells handmade stoneware dishes for everyday use. A potter for 25 years, she started the business about 4-1/2 years ago.

She has consistent sales at the Halifax Seaport Market every week, and is particularly delighted when tourists come back each time they return to the area, and choose one of her treasures to take back home as a remembrance of their trip to Nova Scotia.

Working on a two week production cycle in her home studio, she

meticulously creates stunning goblets, mugs, teacups, speciality tea bowls, plates, various sizes of bowls from small spice bowls to larger serving bowls, serving dishes, platters, pitchers, teapots, and she recently crafted a sink. She creates all her own glazes, and all items are food safe, fridge and microwave safe, but should not be used in the oven.

LiLynn feels that eating and drinking are such a big part of our lives, it seems fitting to use beautiful pieces of art as our receptacles. With this in mind, she keeps the price of her dishes reasonable and accessible so that people will use and love them.

WaterDragon also produces awards for various associations and conferences and she provided the Bluenose marathon awards for two years.

A notable initiative is that several times a year, WaterDragon has a Seconds Sale where 100% of the proceeds go directly to Parker Street Food & Furniture Bank to help provide food, heat, shelter, as well as love, empa-

thy and dignity for those who need it most. LiLynn volunteers at the Food Bank and was raised to be charitable as a normal part of life. When you give, karma comes back to reward you in more ways than you can imagine. She hopes people will be inspired to explore for themselves how they can make the world a better place. When everyone does a little, it makes a lot of difference

Born in Vancouver, LiLynn grew up mostly in Ontario then lived in the States where she learned her craft while working at Greenbridge Pottery in Maryland during high school. She returned to the west coast and continued working with clay. When she moved to Nova Scotia in 2005 she had no intention of staying and planned to move back to British Columbia eventually. However, she fell in love with our beautiful province and plans to stay. Halifax is a great place, a loyal city that loves to support local.

# Enhancing pedestrian safety in District 9 – Halifax West Armdale

This summer will see some big improvements to pedestrian safety across District 9 in Halifax. Every year, approximately two hundred car-pedestrian collisions occur in our city and about half of those happen in marked and unmarked legal crosswalks. This summer, Halifax is taking steps to enhance pedestrian safety.

## Chebucto Road

Over the years, a number of requests for a marked crosswalk on Chebucto Road between Connaught Avenue and Mumford Road have been received and investigated by Traffic Management staff. According to the traffic analysts, the wide and multi-lane nature of Chebucto Road in this area makes it inappropriate for a standard crosswalk installation with signage and zebra pavement markings. As a result, a marked crosswalk with overhead and side-mount flashing beacons will be installed on Chebucto Road at Benjamin Green Drive this year.

## Williams Lake Road

I have heard many concerns over pedestrian safety along Williams Lake Road, especially near Ravenscraig Drive, as many children cross to access Ravenscraig Field and playground, and the nearby Williams Lake Beach and Cunard Junior High.

Previous Traffic Management data collected at the Ravenscraig intersec-

tion indicated that a marked crosswalk on Williams Lake Road was warranted, however, the awkward sight lines for drivers heading east means a standard marked crosswalk could actually be dangerous, as motorists may not have enough time to safely stop. This location has been identified as a candidate for inclusion in a trial program currently being undertaken by Halifax for installation of Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacon technology, which includes push-button activated side-mount LED flashers, which provide significantly increased visibility. In addition, sidewalk infrastructure at the intersection will be upgraded as part of this installation.

## St Margaret's Bay Road

St. Margaret's Bay Road is getting much needed repaving this summer. As the old roadway gets lifted, the asphalt sidewalk will be taken out as well. In its place will be proper sidewalks – on both sides of the road, from Douglas to Fenerty. This will finally give pedestrians safe passage on a road that sees a lot of fast moving vehicles.

We need to do everything we can to keep people safe and I will be pushing for even more improvement to our roads, sidewalks, and trails in the future.
