I did it because it was right

I ran into Earle Wagner at Dill's veggie truck in Spryfield the other day, snapping up the last of the fresh corn. Who knew it lasts into Halloween these days? He was zipping between engagements- speaking to school kids and a meeting- but agreed to sit down with me, although it's been done before, including for this paper. Captain Earle Wagner is a man you can Google, and it's worth doing; he's made a lot of news in his nine decades so far. I made an appointment because his calendar is pretty booked.

He's a Lunenburg boy, a fisherman's son born and bred from generations of German pioneers. A painting of the ship, the Gale, that his pioneer forefather,

Johann Heinrich Wagner, sailed on to the new world in 1752 hangs on his wall beside other paintings of ships, some he captained in over 70 years as a master mariner. He has cases of beautiful ships models as well, some inherited, some presented, some bought for love.

He tried to join the navy at fifteen, "when all hell broke loose on a peaceful world" but they said no. So he joined the merchant navy, the fourth arm of the fighting services to the army, navy and airforce. Unarmed, they carried supplies- equipment, food, oil, munitions- to the troops and civilians overseas and paid a terrible price: one in seven merchant mariners died at sea, a higher casualty rate than any of the other armed forces (CBC digital archives). I did it

the Reginolite along the North Atlantic coast— that’s right out here, folks, in sight of land, not in far off Europe—he witnessed the devastating power of the Nazi U-boats in the remains of fourteen Allied ships with their men resting on the ocean floor.

By nineteen, Earle was already a ship’s officer, destined for many promotions and a believer in continuous learning. He has done it all from deck swabber to pilot, captain, port warden, fleet manager and a host of other responsibilities I can neither imagine nor spell.

War over? Earle was just getting started. He captained ships to provision the Canadian Arctic Distant Early Warning (DEW) line radar stations during the Cold War using WWII Landing Ship Tank vessels out of Tuktoyaktuk that could run up on shore at Cape Perry and Cambridge Bay. He became Marine Superintendent for the Maritime Provinces in the Department of Fisheries and Oceans, and ran “the most efficient operation out of Halifax”. Well, if you know how government operates, that might well figure among his greatest accomplishments.

You may recall—I certainly do—being shocked and dismayed that following the war, merchant seaman were not given pension and benefits in keeping with their sacrifice for us, an ongoing battle in the news throughout my lifetime. And then one day nearly 55 years late, in 2000, there was a big announcement and suddenly there were pensions for the merchant seamen remaining. Why? Because a certain Captain Wagner would not quit fighting for them “because it was right”. He also fought and won the battle to get a memorial down on the waterfront, which he happened to design and get funded and approved. Its moving symbolism is described on a site called War Monuments in Canada, <https://www.cdli.ca/monuments/ns/merchant.htm>.

So he’s resting on his laurels, right? No way! No mobility or energy issues to slow him down. He organizes folks to “get things done”, like cross country memorial plaques; he also speaks pub-

licly, hikes, drives, writes, including a memoir, raises funds, sings in the New Players Choral Society, takes classes; teaches himself to play the ukulele; maintains relations with kids and grand-kids, and supports his community from his own apartment, where he cooks and entertains, and conducts many more substantial enterprises than my weary fingers could note down.

What does he tell the school kids? Well, if he told us he’d have to stop; that’s the only life story he has. Try to sit in if you have a grandchild who’ll let you. But I don’t think the clincher can be said often enough: War is hell. Don’t do it.

On Christmas Day, Captain Wagner turns ninety. Let us wish him a warm Happy Birthday and many more: his presence enriches our lives. And for Remembrance Day, you might like to Google him. Spread the word of a real war hero among us. More a role model today than ever. Biggest lesson? “Don’t ever give in to bullies”. Said and lived. I hope there’ll be a movie someday. Soon.

From soup kitchens to food banks

Most of us tend to think of Food Banks as something relatively new and those who benefit from them as being products of our modern world. In many ways this is true but in Halifax we have a long history of helping the unfortunate among us.

For example, after the War of 1812, there were Soup Kitchens on the Parade Square in downtown Halifax. Samuel Cunard (yes, he who founded the Cunard Steamship Company, at one time the largest steamship company in the world) worked at that Soup Kitchen. He and his wife Susan donated food and then served it to the hungry. This is a long way from modern food banks, in both time and style but the need and the support are similar.

I was reminded of this when I attended the opening events of Feed Nova Scotia's annual conference in September. Throughout the evening, various food banks were recognized for the work they do. Each offers more than just food and it was easy to see the dedication in each individual food bank. Of course, as Chair of the Board of St. Paul's Family Resources Insti-

tute, (FRI), I was waiting to hear what would be said about our food bank. We were the last ones mentioned and Feed Nova Scotia recognized the national award that was given to St. Paul's FRI Food Bank in the spring. At that time, Food Banks Canada gave just 3 national awards for Excellence in Food Banking, one for small food banks, one for medium sized food banks and one for large food banks. St. Paul's Family Resources Institute received the award for small food banks.

At FRI, which is the outreach ministry of St. Paul's United Church in Spryfield, we are not just a food bank. We offer a lot of services to our clients and hearing them all listed together, it was obvious why we had been recognized by Food Banks Canada. We have a Food Bank Café where clients can have coffee and a snack while waiting to pick up their order rather than waiting out in the cold and/or rain; we offer a volunteer income tax service to those with limited income; Dal Legal Aid is often on hand to address concerns individuals may have; we're fine tuning our Food, Fitness and Fun class; nursing students are often on hand to offer advice; our

minister, Reverend Jeanne Manning Straight is in attendance to meet and talk with the clients; nursing students from Mount Saint Vincent University provide tips on health and nutrition; and the Book Buddies program has been successful.

Our programs change from time to time due to need, funding and volunteers. This was certainly true in the past as well and means we must be aware of what is happening in the community. Right now, we are preparing for our busiest time of the year, Christmas. Last year, FRI provided Christmas baskets of food to more than 150 families. We also had a large toy store set up where

clients were able to choose toys for their children.

As in the days when Samuel Cunard worked at a Soup Kitchen on the Grand Parade, those organizations which help the poor also need help. The style of delivery has changed but the need is still there. At the FRI Food Bank, we get help from the United Church, from Feed Nova Scotia, from private donors and from many volunteers. Our date to give out Christmas baskets is December 18 and the work all gets done before that.

DISCOVERING OUR PAST

Local families mourned World War II casualties

In 2014, the 100th anniversary of the beginning of the First World War (1914 to 1918) will be remembered. At their February 22nd Heritage Tea and Display the Mainland South Heritage Society will honour those who went to war and will pay tribute to those men from the communities in Mainland South who were killed in action. For the purpose of this article I have included the names of local men who were casualties of the Second World War

During the Second World War, between 1939 and 1945, many local men and women joined the Canadian Navy, Army, Air Force or Merchant Marines; others joined United States or British Regiments. Several were killed in action and buried in Canadian War Cemeteries in the Netherlands, Italy, France, Belgium, Norway and England; the graves of some are still unknown.

From Sambro: Private Gordon Mercer, age 20, was the son of Henry and Elizabeth Mercer and was a member of the Stormont, Dundas and Glengarry Highlanders Regiment, RCIC. He died 1 Nov. 1944 and was buried in Adegm Canadian Cemetery in Belgium.

Also from Sambro: Boatswain James McPhee, son of Mr. and Mrs. William McPhee, was a member of the Canadian Merchant Navy, SS "Western Head," Nassau. He was lost at sea 28 May 1942; no known grave.

From Jollimore: Platoon Sergeant John (Jack) C. Forward, age 23, son of Edward and Harriet Forward, died 30 Mar. 1945 of wounds he received in a battle along the Rhine while fighting with the Regina Rifles. He was buried in the Canadian War Cemetery in the Netherlands, very close to the German frontier.

From Jollimore: Staff Sergeant Daniel Serrick, age 23, the son of Daniel and Mabel Serrick, died 29 May 1944 in Italy. He joined the Manchester Regiment in 1938 and later transferred to an elite fighting unit known as the First Special Service Force made up of Canadian and American troops. Daniel received several decorations for bravery, one of which, the Silver Star, was awarded posthumously by the government of the United States. He was buried in Beach Head War Cemetery, Anzio, Italy.

From Jollimore: Captain Evatt F.A.

Merchant, son of Frank and Eva Merchant, died 18 Nov. 1844. He was a member of the Queen's Own Cameron Highlanders, 5th Unit, RCIC (a Canloan officer). He was buried in Mierlo War Cemetery, Netherlands.

From Melville Cove: Flying Officer (Pilot) David A.A. Romans, age 23, son of David J. and Rachel Romans, died 8 Sept. 1941. He flew with the RAF 90 Squadron and was awarded the Distinguished Flying Cross. He was buried in Bygland Churchyard, Norway.

From Armdale: Private Edward Drililio, age 21, son of Gordon and Margaret Drililio, died 23 May 1944 while fighting with the West Nova Regiment, RCIC. He was buried in Cassino War Cemetery, Italy.

From Armdale: Flight Lieutenant Patrick Terrance O'Leary, age 22, son of Michael D. and Ethel A. O'Leary, died 27 Feb. 1943. He was a member of RCAF 403 Squadron and was buried at Runnymede Memorial Cemetery, Surrey, England.

From Armdale: Able Seaman Robert L. Yeadon, age 23, son of Andrew W. and Florence L. Yeadon, died 29 Apr. 1944. Robert was a Royal Canadian Naval Volunteer aboard HMCS "Athabaska" when it was torpedoed in the English Channel. He was buried in Isle-De-Batz Cemetery, France.

From Armdale: Joseph Leo Lannigan, age 22, son of Joseph L. and Gertrude Lannigan, died 13 Dec. 1941. A member of the Royal Canadian Artil-

lery, his grave site is unknown.

From Ferguson's Cove: Gunner Dougald Robert Gargan, age 19, son of William and Lucy gargan, died 2 Nov. 1939 as the result of a diabetic coma. His mother was a school teacher for many years in Ferguson's Cove. He served in the Royal Canadian Artillery and was buried in Ferguson's Cove Cemetery.

From Spryfield: Shipwright Gordon W. MacDougall, age 24, son of Edward A. and Annie F. MacDougall, died 22 Oct. 1940. He served with the Royal Canadian Navy aboard HMCS "Margaree" and was lost at sea when the ship collided with a freighter in the North Atlantic while escorting a convoy.

From Spryfield: Sergeant (Pilot) John Frederick Duggan, age 19, son of William P. and Gertrude Duggan, died

4 Oct. 1941. He was buried in Moreton-In-Marsh New Cemetery, Gloucestershire, England.

From Spryfield: Gunner Edward (Ted) Charles Kidston, age 38, adopted son of John and Bessie (Geizer) Kidston, died 25 July 1944 while serving with the Royal Canadian Artillery. His wife, Helen Margaret Kidston, lived in Vancouver, B.C. He was buried in Brettville-Sur-Laize Canadian War Cemetery, Calvados, France.

From Harrietsfield: Seaman Arthur Vatcher, age 40, died 2 Nov. 1942. He was with the Merchant Navy aboard SS "Rose Castle" when it was torpedoed by a German submarine in Conception Bay, Nfld. Born in Newfoundland, his wife, Jane Vatcher, lived in Harrietsfield. No known grave.





Park and Recreation Centre Upgrades Underway

Have you seen construction crews in your favourite park? If so, you're not the only one: upgrades are underway in green spaces and at recreation facilities across District 9.

At Chocolate Lake Beach, HRM is building a 55 x 35 foot washroom facility to better accommodate beach goers. The structure will be wheelchair accessible and have bathrooms and change rooms equipped with change tables for young children. For greater accessibility, an 8 foot pathway, approved by the Accessibility Advisory Committee, will be installed to connect the parking lot to the tennis courts, washrooms, and swim area. Dora Construction Limited has been awarded both projects.

Meanwhile in the West End, construction is coming to an end at Flinn Park. HRM has installed a gravel path along MacDonald and Flinn streets thereby creating a full loop around the park. This project was identified as a top priority by park users who participated in two rounds of consultation in 2010 and 2011. Wild rose bushes will be planted along the rail line and a decorative park sign will hang at the corner of MacDonald Street and Quinpool Road.

Council is also a few weeks away from voting on work at Fleming Park. HRM staff has reviewed bids for the seawall restoration project, and will present findings later this month. The replacement of the wall is necessary as it is failing in several areas and starting to wash out in high tide or surge events. In fact, the wall will be constructed higher than before in anticipation of rising sea levels. The company selected for the project will supply and install large granite stones to shore up a 150 metre stretch in front of Dingle Tower. While work is underway, public access will be restricted in the area in question and in the parking area next to the playground, where the contractor will stockpile materials. The work will be completed in June 2014.

Finally, I'm excited to tell you about proposed renovations to the St. Andrew's Recreation Centre. Located on Bayers Road, this old school remains an important community hub but has not undergone significant renovations since 1983. HRM has set aside approxi-

mately \$4 million to make the building more accessible and multi-functional. Inside, we will create a more inviting entryway, add an elevator, make rooms more versatile, and replace the heating system. Improvements will also extend

Moreover, there appears to be an issue with allowing anyone on the property to help refurbish this structure. (For those of you who may not be familiar with this building, picture a red pyramid with the top cut off and a light on top).

I am scheduled to speak with the Minister of Fisheries and Oceans to find a way to gain access. These improvements will not cost the Federal, or provincial, governments anything.

I want to assure you that our staff has been actively working on the Chebucto Head Road matter. A report is being prepared for an upcoming Regional Council session. Staff is taking extra care to ensure the report contains all pertinent information available. I remain hopeful that the matter may be in front of Council very soon.

As some may know, or may have read in the Chebucto News, Spryfield has a Junior C Hockey Team. This team plays other teams throughout the province, and offers some very enter-




